

Statement on Technology in Art

Within the context of my work, computer graphics technologies are used to facilitate the conceptualization of my creative ideas. In this regard, I view myself as an artist who uses computers and not as a computer artist since the concepts behind the work determine the technologies that are used to bring them into being.

While initially drawn to computer graphic technologies as a tool of pre-visualization and design, my current sculptural practice employs them as tools of fabrication.

Rapid proto-typing bridges the gap between the object and its formative process. In this practice data generated in the virtual environment is used to create a real-world object that reflects my artistic philosophy.



Teaching Philosophy:

I don't teach subjects, I teach people.

Inspiring students to think in new ways and to set high standards for creativity and excellence drives my teaching philosophy. As a teacher I foster a learning environment in which student participation and peer teaching become an active part of the classroom learning experience. In this environment teamwork, research and multidisciplinary thinking is valued. Problems are broad conceptually, thus forcing students to find individual solutions. Students are encourages to employ synectics problem strategies as they resolve their creative issues. Critiques are used to provide students with an opportunity to present and defend their ideas and solutions.

In sculpture and three dimensional design an understanding of the nature of tools and their application is essential if students are going to express their ideas in a coherent manner. Therefore, high levels of craftsmanship and a fundamental understanding of the nature of form and space is stressed. Students are encouraged to master both through repetition and serious enquiry.

As a teacher in computer art, I demystify technologies and provide students with a broad understanding of the nature of these systems and how they relate to traditional studio practices. I inculcate a firm conceptual understanding of the nature of computer systems and output devices so that students can begin to incorporate them into their own unique creative visions. Over time, I develop confident and competent students who can apply their computing skills to any field of creative endeavor.


